Bob Boll moved to Slinger in 1956 from Prairie du Sac. His freshman year he participated in football, basketball, and track, earning a letter in track. His sophomore year he participated in football, basketball, volleyball, baseball, and track, earning letters in all sports, and was named most valuable athlete for the track team. Bob's junior and senior years he competed in all sports again, earning most valuable athlete in basketball and football. Throughout the course of Bob's athletic career he earned 18 athletic letters.

Upon graduation in 1959, he attended the University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point on a football scholarship. He played defensive end his freshman and sophomore years. During his sophomore year he was activated by the National Guard to Fort Lewis, Washington during the Berlin Crisis for 15 months. After his stint with the National Guard, he returned to Stevens Point for his junior year. Due to injuries to both of his knees, his football career came to an end.

Bob then attended a computer technical school, and upon graduation he was hired by Badger Meter in Brown Deer working in their IT department. He spent 38 years working for Badger Meter, finally retiring in 2002.

Bob is grateful for a wonderful family and is thankful to the Slinger High School Athletic Hall of Fame for considering him for this honor.
