WEATHER DELAYS AND CANCELLATIONS

Decisions about inclement weather impacting your school's hours of operation will be communicated through the following means:

- 1) **Slinger School District website:** www.slinger.k12.wi.us
- 2) **TV: Channels 4, 6, 12, and 58**
- 3) **School District Phone message**
- 4) **Slinger School District mass email message (as needed)**



Weather conditions could result in the one of three actions being taken by the District:

- 1) **A Two Hour Delay:** to allow road crews time to clear the roads
- 2) **A School Closing:** because unsafe conditions will persist all day
- 3) **An Early Release:** due to impending unsafe conditions at normal dismissal time

With regards to wind chill weather decisions we will use the following as a guideline:

- 1) **Wind Chill Advisory:** School will remain open
- 2) **Wind Chill Warning:** School will likely close

2024 GRADUATE INFORMATION



A note to senior parents and students: In December, senior names will be posted on the wall outside of the main office to verify the correct spelling of the students' name that will be printed on diplomas. Students **MUST** either approve of or correct the spelling of their names with Mrs. Olson in the office. Any diplomas that have to be ordered a second time because of an error in the name will have to be billed to you in advance of ordering. Students should listen to announcements for the date of the posting. Name approvals or corrections need to be taken care of with Mrs. Olson in the office no later than January 26th 2024.

WISCONSIN CIVICS GRADUATION REQUIREMENT

In accordance with Wisconsin State Act 59 all students, starting with the Class of 2017, must take a civic test consisting of 100 questions that are identical to the 100 questions that may be asked of an individual during the process of applying for U.S. citizenship by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services. The student must correctly answer at least 65 of those questions in order to graduate from high school. Those students taking American Studies 3 or AP US Politics and Government with either Mrs. Stolaski or Mr. Wolf this fall will have an opportunity to take this civics exam **on January 8th, 2024 for A day students and on January 9th, 2024 for B day students**. GUIDANCE NEWS

Attention Seniors

Seniors are not required to meet with their counselor; however, counselors are available to help with post-secondary planning and resources. Seniors are encouraged to complete their college applications prior to Thanksgiving break. Students' applications are not considered complete until all documents are received in the admissions office. This includes the application, fee, high school transcript, and ACT/SAT score. This year colleges are test optional for admission. If you want your score considered you will indicate that on your application and must have your scores submitted as part of the completed application. Students can order their official transcript on-line by going to the guidance webpage and clicking on transcripts (the cost is \$4.40 beginning January 1st).

Financial Aid

There will be a financial aid presentation on November 14th from 6:30pm - 7:30 pm in the PAC. Parents of juniors and seniors are encouraged to attend to learn more about using the FAFSA to apply for financial aid.

Scholarships

Scholarship information is available and regularly updated in the guidance office and on the guidance webpage. There are a variety of local and national scholarships along with individual scholarships from colleges and universities. Seniors should check periodically for new scholarships that are available. All seniors planning on attending a technical college or 4-year university are encouraged to apply for the Honors scholarship that comes out in December. Freshman and Sophomore Scheduling

Freshman and sophomore students will receive their course selection options for the 24-25 school year in December. Counselors will be meeting with freshman students in their science class on December 13th and 14th to review their course options. Their course sheets will be due in science class on December 19th or 20th. Sophomores will receive their course sheets in Biology class on December 5th and 6th, and their sheets will be due in Biology on December 11th and 12th. Parents please review the course selection sheet with your son or daughter. If you have any questions please reach out to your students' counselor.

Junior Scheduling & Meetings

Juniors will receive their course selection sheets in early January while in English class and it will be followed up with individual planning meetings beginning 2nd semester. All parents will be invited and encouraged to attend that meeting. This will be a time for us counselors to discuss your student's progress towards graduation, senior year course selection, and their post-secondary plans and timeline. The UW system continues to not require the ACT test for admission for the 2025-2026 school year, however, it is in the best interest for all students to be best prepared to use their score for college admission and scholarships. Please note the following dates:

YOUTH APPRENTICESHIP

The Slinger School District is committed to assisting our graduates reach the highest level of academic and career preparation within various career pathways to enter successfully into the global workforce. Through our Career and Technical Education programs, we give high school students the chance to start preparing for college and careers through the Youth Apprenticeship program.

How Do Youth Apprenticeships Work?

The Youth Apprenticeship (YA) program is a rigorous one- or two-year elective statewide program that combines academic and technical instruction with mentored, paid, on-the-job learning that makes a real world connection for students. High school juniors and seniors are eligible to participate.

INTERNSHIP

Internships help students move from school to the workplace by offering "hands-on" learning, in real work settings, for either a semester or year long period of time. The experience is designed to give students a better sense of the jobs within a particular business or industry, to provide students with information about all aspects of the business, and to aid them in understanding through experience the works of business and industry. Prerequisite: Students are required to have taken an introductory class in the subject area and be enrolled in an advanced class related to their career interest during their senior year. For eligibility requirements, see the School to Work coordinator. Students will be screened and interviewed before admission to the program.

HONOURS, INC



Slinger High School is fortunate to have an outstanding scholarship foundation called Honours, Inc. This community-based foundation provides scholarship money to assist graduates of Slinger High School bound for colleges as well as vocational/technical schools. Last year, \$276,700 was awarded to 54 Slinger graduates who received these competitive scholarships. This program has awarded 1,195 scholarships totaling over 3.4 million dollars since 1985. Seniors this year will be informed of the Honours, Inc. scholarship opportunity before the winter break and also the first week of January. Completed applications will be due back in the guidance office with the due date listed and references due a week earlier.

SEMESTER EXAMS



A special schedule is followed for semester exams and you will find the exam schedule for semester one below. Semester exams are important and can count for as much as 20% of the final grade in a class. The exam periods are 90 minutes and students are not released early from their exam, even if the exam ends early.

Please note we run an open campus during semester exams. That means that students do not need to be in the building if they don't have an exam. Students who fail to show up for a scheduled exam without a valid parent excuse may receive a zero for the exam. Please read the exam guidelines listed below the schedule. SEMESTER EXAMS GUIDELINES & COMMENTS

1. Students are to be at their exams on time. Students who are tardy for an exam will not be allowed into the classroom. Tardy & unexcused students may lose the opportunity to take the final exam. All students must take all exams during the assigned time on the exam schedule.
2. Students MAY NOT switch testing periods without written permission from an administrator. Switches will only be permitted under extenuating circumstances that are confirmed by parents.
3. Students are not required to report to school at times they do not have exams. All students in the building but not taking an exam are to be in their assigned study hall. Students must remain out of other school district buildings and off middle school property.
4. Students are not to be in the halls or at their lockers during exam periods. Students may go to lockers during the break periods. Students arriving early for an exam must go to the cafeteria until the next break.
5. Teachers are not to dismiss students early.
6. There will be only one lunch each day. Students may leave school during lunch. Students should not loiter in the parking lot. Students are held solely responsible for returning on time for their next exam.
7. The resource period is an open study time. Students must be in the cafeteria study hall or library. Students with a pass may also seek teacher assistance. Hallways should remain clear.

ATHLETIC Registration Process for the 2023-24 School year

In order to participate in practice and competitions, three requirements must be met. You must have an up-to-date physical on file at Slinger High School, you must have the \$100 athletic fee paid, and you must have the "SHS 2023-24 Athletic Agreements and Information" form filled out in Skyward Family Access.

1.) Physical Exam – All students participating in interscholastic athletics must have a physical form dated April 1, 2022 or later on file at Slinger High School. The form must be completed and signed by a physician **AND** a parent. If the physical is dated April 1, 2023 or later then the physical form is all that is needed.

WIAA Tournament Prices

When our teams participate in the WIAA Regional and/or Sectional Tournaments, our athletic department is required to submit a financial form to the WIAA. The WIAA, for each sport, has created a formula to share the revenue from those events. That is the reason why we charge admission for WIAA Tournament games. Unfortunately, we are unable to accept senior citizen passes, student activity passes, or conference passes.

The shared money that the Slinger Athletic Department receives for hosting WIAA Tournament events goes to pay the officials and workers for those events. Any surplus is deposited into an account and it is used (and needed), to pay for any team expenses when we travel to Regional/Sectional contests or when individuals/teams qualify for State competition.

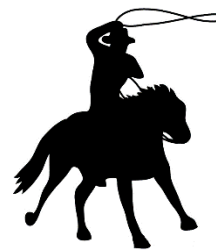
