Parents are encouraged to call this number when a student will be absent. **Please call before 9:00 a.m. the morning of the absence.** This is an automated number and can be called anytime of the day or night so a parent could call the absence in before going to work in the morning. School personnel will call parents at home or work if a student is absent and the school has not been notified prior to 9:00 a.m.

**School Hours:** 8:40-3:40 p.m. 5K-5th grade students must be in the classroom ready to go by 8:40 a.m. Students should not arrive to school before 8:30 a.m. The bell will ring at 3:40 p.m. to dismiss students. Busses depart by 3:45 p.m. 4K hours: AM – 8:40-11:30 a.m. PM – 12:50-3:40 p.m.

**Matriculation/Registration Fee:** The fee for elementary students is \$55.00 per student and must be paid by August 1. Please make checks payable to **Slinger School District**. Do **NOT** include lunch money in the amount of this check. A separate check will have to be made out for the lunch program.

The Slinger School District uses a computerized debit lunch accounting system. The system is family-based so that parents and guardians can remit one check to cover all of their students' meals for a given period of time. Hot lunch will be served daily. Milk is available for cold lunches and money for milk must be deposited into the family account as well. **A check or money order should be made out to the "Slinger Food Service" and mailed or returned to the district office BEFORE the start of school in the pre-printed Food Service envelope.** (Please do NOT include the registration fee with your lunch deposit.) Additional envelopes are available in all school offices for future deposits. The district will utilize a computer call system to notify you when the account is below \$8.00. For any questions regarding your lunch account, please call Slinger Food Service.

Free and reduced meals applications will be available online, in the school offices, or from the Food Service Dept. after July 15. A new form must be on file at the start of each school year in order to benefit from this program as it does not carry over from the prior school year. Please follow the instructions if you wish to apply for these benefits for the new school year.

**School Security:** All schools in the district have carefully reviewed building safety policies and procedures. In order to provide improved security and supervision of visitors, all doors of the school will be locked during school hours. **Visitors must report to the office, sign in, and leave your driver's license in the office to secure a pass to be able to visit at school.** When picking up your child after school, please wait in the lobby until classes are dismissed as you will not be allowed to go beyond.

**School Pictures** will be taken on September 14. Order forms and envelopes will be sent home in advance with your child. Retakes will be taken on October 26.

**School Calendar:** Enclosed is a calendar for the entire year including the A,B,C rotation of days scheduled for Art, Music, and Phy. Ed., along with days off and other important dates.

**Report Cards:** Report cards will only be available electronically each grading period in Skyward by using your Family Access account and accessing the portfolio.

**School Communication:** Monthly newsletters with important school information and upcoming events will be sent home via email. The newsletters and lunch menu may be found on the Allenton webpage. If you do not have internet access, please contact the office or your child's teacher to have a paper copy sent home.

**Health Room:** Students who become sick or injured at school can report to the health room. We can offer immediate first aid or comfort. Students who are too sick to attend the remainder of the school day, and who may be spreading germs will be sent home. Please be sure your emergency contact information is updated and accurate. The emergency contact should not be the parents. The following guidelines from the State Medical Society of Wisconsin Auxiliary are to assist parents in making an informed decision whether to send a child to school or keep him/her home:

**Fever:** A fever is a warning sign that all is not right with the body. The best way to check for fever is with a thermometer, which every home should have. A child with an oral temperature of **100 degrees** or higher should **not** be sent to school even though the fever may have subsided due to taking fever-reducing medication. Rest at the onset of an illness conserves energy providing the body strength to resist infection. Do not allow your child to return to school until he/she has been **free of fever for 24 hours**.

**Colds:** If your child has a cold, he/she may attend school unless accompanied with a hacking cough or heavy nasal congestion; then he/she belongs at home, even if there's no fever. If your child complains of a sore throat and has no other symptoms, he/she may attend school. If white spots can be seen in the back of the throat or a fever is present, keep him/her at home and call your doctor.

**Rash:** A rash may be the first sign of a childhood illness, such as Chicken Pox, Measles, Fifth Disease, etc. A rash or "spots" may cover the entire body or may appear in only one area. Do not send a child with a rash to school until your doctor has been seen or consulted.

**Vomiting/Diarrhea/Stomachache:** If vomiting occurs, keep your child home until he/she can keep food and liquids down. A child with diarrhea should be kept at home as well. Call your doctor if prompt improvement does not occur. Consult your doctor if your child has a stomachache that is persistent or severe enough to limit his/her activity.

**Medication in School:** Any child who requires medication at school **must** have a medication form (enclosed) signed by the parent on file. Prescription drugs require a doctor's signature, as well the parent's, and must be kept in the office in the original prescription bottle. All medications, both prescription and non-prescription, should be brought to the office and are to be given with adult supervision. The school does not have aspirin, non-aspirin or ibuprofen to dispense to students should the student become ill during the day.

**Volunteer request:** We are in constant need of volunteers at school. Look for a flier at the Open House or sent home with your child asking for your help in the classroom or projects that could be done at home.

**Fundraisers:** We are saving the "General Mills Box Tops". Please remember to send those to school as each box top will be worth 10-cents. Proceeds from this fundraiser pays for special programs, assemblies, student projects, and school improvements.
