

## **420 SCHOOL ADMISSION**

### Admission and Eligibility

The District shall admit children who qualify by age and are residents of the school district. The District shall not discriminate in admission to any school, class, program or activity or facilities usage on the basis of sex, race, religion, national origin, color, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, physical, mental, emotional or learning disability or handicap. This policy does not, however, prohibit the District from placing a student in a school, class, program or activity based on object standards of individual performance or need.

The District may admit students who reside in another district based on state statute and the criteria outlined in the public school open enrollment policy. However, as per section 120.13 (1) (f) of the state statutes, the District shall not admit students from another school district during the term of their expulsion. Children shall be required to be enrolled as full-time students as established by district policy. However, the district shall accept resident children who are enrolled in basic education in a private school, in a home based educational program, or non-residents who attend school in another district and are accepted by the district as open enrollment students as outlined in board policy 423, as part-time students in no more than two high school courses, either required or elective.

Parents or guardians of students admitted to the District's elementary and secondary schools shall present immunization records as required by law. Parents/guardians of students entering kindergarten shall be requested to provide evidence that his/her child has had his/her eyes examined or evaluated.
