

RODEE SCHNEIDER

Athlete

A three-sport letterman in football, track and baseball, Rodee Schneider set school and state records while helping lead the Owl's to their first WIAA state football championship. The 1999 graduate began his varsity career as a freshman, competing for the first of many conference champion track teams. He was brought up to the varsity football team his sophomore year, and as an undersized defensive end, he went on to lead the team in sacks and forced fumbles.

As the starting running back and defensive end for the 1997 WIAA state runner-up football team, Rodee was named 2nd Team All-Conference, Honorable Mention All-Area, and led the team in rushing yards and touchdowns.

His senior season saw the completion of the football team's championship dream, when they beat Denmark 44-20 at Camp Randall Stadium. His four trips to the end zone in that game tied a WIAA record for touchdowns in a championship, and brought his season total to 34. He went on to be named Team MVP, Parkland Conference MVP, 1st Team Offense and 2nd Team Defense All-Conference, All Washington County 1st Team Offense and Defense, All-Region, All-State and All-Area Honorable Mention, a Milwaukee Journal Sentinel Preps Plus Athlete of the Week, and Wisconsin Shine Bowl participant.

During the 1999 track season, Rodee was captain and MVP for a squad that swept the Parkland Conference Championships. He won golds and set records in the 300 meter (39.5) and 110 meter hurdles (14.8) enroute to advancing to the state competition, where he finished 6th and 8th in his events.
