

# Criteria Free Reading

1. We will have a reading class period once a week for you to read.
2. You can read fiction or nonfiction. Magazines and newspapers are fine also. Plan ahead, have materials here. NO CATALOGS.
3. If we are reading a trade book in class, you can read the trade book during free reading if you are *behind*. Reading your trade book outside of class can count on your reading log also if you don't complete a given assignment in class.
4. Your reading log needs to be signed by your parents or a teacher each time you read.
5. During free reading it is a quiet time to READ. Don't abuse the time you have, use it wisely!!!
6. If materials for free reading are not brought to class, you will NOT be allowed to go to your locker.
