Summer School Student Rules

- 1. Students are to arrive on the school grounds no earlier than 7:30 a.m.
- 2. Once at school, students will stay in the Middle School cafeteria until 7:40 a.m.
- 3. No soda or soft drink will be allowed in the school building during the summer school session. The soda and snack machines are NOT to be used by students.
- 4. Electronics (game systems, cell phones) may not be used at school.
- 5. Students with cars are to park them in the designated area. They are not to go back to them until they are dismissed for the school day or are given special permission.
- 6. Students are to stay in their classroom areas or under the direct supervision of teachers during breaks or recesses.
- 7. Students are not to leave the school grounds at any time unless they have been dismissed to go home or have been given special permission by a summer school administrator.
- 8. All school grounds are drug-free and tobacco-free zones.
- 9. In addition to these rules, the individual building rules and bus rules that are enforced during the normal school year are in effect as well.

Any violation of the above listed rules or any disruptive behavior of any kind can result in the student being suspended from summer school classes or bus services.

All summer school classes are held at Slinger Middle School.

2020 ELEMENTARY SUMMER SCHOOL COURSE OFFERINGS:

ABT-American Red Cross Babysitter's Training Grade 5

(15 student minimum for each period)

This course is designed to provide youth who are planning to babysit with the knowledge and skills necessary to safely and responsibly give care for children and infants. This training will help participants to develop leadership skills, learn how to develop a babysitting business, keep themselves and others safe and help children behave, and learn about basic child care and basic first aid. Attendance is mandatory. Missing more than 2 classes will result in the student not earning the American Red Cross Babysitter's Training Certificate.

HSC-HIGH SCHOOL CORRECTIVES

Grades 9-12

7:45 A.M. to 11:50 A.M.

The purpose of the high school course offerings is to give high school students additional opportunities to complete regular courses and earn credits towards graduation. Students must apply through their guidance counselor and must meet the requirements for enrollment as established by the high school's administrators.

There is a separate secondary school application form available in the high school office.

<u>**VERY IMPORTANT** DROP-OFF AND PICK-UP PROCEDURES</u> Morning Drop-off Procedures

To ensure the safety of students, we ask parents dropping off students in the morning to use the **Olympic Drive entrance** (TOP ENTRANCE) <u>only</u>.



Afternoon Pick-Up Procedures

Parents may only use the **Olympic Drive entrance** (TOP ENTRANCE) for student pick-up at the end of the school day. The **Lou's Way entrance** (BOTTOM ENTRANCE) will only be used for students riding the busses.



FREQUENTLY ASKED SUMMER SCHOOL QUESTIONS

Question #1: What grade does my child register for in Summer School?

Answer: Summer School is a continuation of the regular school year. Therefore, your son or daughter will register for classes offered to that grade. (<u>ex</u>. Student A was in 4th grade during the 2019-2020 school year. Student A will register as a 4th grade student for Summer School)

Question #2: Who qualifies for Summer School?

Answer: Summer School is offered to students that meet one of the following criteria:

- 1) District Resident
- 2) Student currently open-enrolled into the School District of Slinger.
- 3) Student with accepted open-enrollment status for next school year.
- 4) Out of district student, if space is available AND tuition is required.

Question #3: Why must I schedule classes no later than **April 3**rd?

Answer: Once classes are set, teachers must be hired, supplies ordered and bus routes established. All of these tasks take time to complete. Therefore, any student who registers after **April 3rd** will have to use an established bus stop if a seat is available in the desired class.

Question #4: If summer school is voluntary for most students why is it necessary to call and report a student's absence?

Answer: In these days of two-income families, it is possible for a student to miss the bus while his/her parents are at work assuming that he/she is safe at summer school. For younger children this is a definite safety concern and for older children there is a definite behavior concern. Either way, we need your help to make sure that your children are where they are supposed to be. *Please use the attendance line (262) 644-9307 to report all absences.*

Question #5: Why can't I bring my child to summer school on the first day and then expect him/her to ride the bus home?

Answer: Students will most likely have a different summer school bus route and driver than during the regular school year. If a parent drops off a child, he/she will not know the new driver and will have no idea which bus to take home. This can be a traumatic experience for your child on the first day of Summer School.

Question #6: What if my child needs to be picked up at one location and dropped off at another?

Answer: Parents will be required to contact Riteway Bus Company after registering via email **IF** your child will be picked up or dropped off at a location other than your assigned daily stop location. Contact Riteway Bus Company at <u>slinger@goriteway.com</u>.

After scheduling your student's classes, please allow one (1) business day before going into your Skyward Family Access account (Fee Management Tab) to verify the student charges and make your payment. You may pay either using e-funds (the District's on-line payment system) or by dropping your payment off at the district office, 207 Polk Street (checks payable to School District of Slinger). District office hours are M-F, 7am to 4pm. There is also a drop box located outside of the district office doors for after hour deposits.

In order to hold your student's spot in the selected classes, payment must be received no later than 4pm on **April 10th, 2020**.
